

Donseed links up with insurer

The management software company Donseed and a major international insurance company have agreed a new alliance which will use Donseed's products to improve records and speed up claims, thus reducing the costs for RSA Insurance Group plc.

Donseed, based at Kerry Technology Park, and RSA spent six months in negotiations to develop the new risk management module.

As a result, RSA clients will have the capacity to notify head office, the broker and RSA's claims handler as well as the Health and Safety Executive (if a reportable incident in the UK is involved) simultaneously in the event of an accident.

Donseed's systems operate on the mobile telecommunications network and does not need phone lines or broadband to operate. It requires just a 12v electrical supply, such as the use of a car battery.

Donseed established its workplace management services in Tralee in 2007 to provide a system of real time analysis of attendance and online reporting covering a number of sites which obviates the necessity for keeping manual timesheets and consequential inputs to payroll systems.

It operates from fingerprint identification of employees and has particular application in the construction industry where monitoring of a number of sites is required.

"We have been delivering significant savings and control to UK construction companies for nearly two years and this is further validation of the range of benefits we are delivering," Vincent Lynch, Donseed's CEO said.
